
The action by the Executive Committee pertains only to 1974. You will still be obligated to pay 1975 dues to keep your membership active.



I hope you can help me with this membership problem. It's a case of the member being caught up in the system and the system not being sensative to the particular situation because actual details were not known.

Mr. Carl Lloyd Aimes was terminated in 1974 for non-payment of dues after close to forty years as an Associate members of the Wisconsin Component and a Corporate member of the Institute. (He was approved as a Corporate member in 1946.)

At the time of Carl's termination he was fighting a financial situation brought about by a lingering illness of his wife who did finally pass away. Although we did not know all of the circumstances at that time, he did ask for help in the way of a waiver locally which was given. At the same time he was asked about Emeritus but declined for fear he would not be able to practice and support the medical help his wife needed at the time. Now that our Executive Committee is more familiar with the situation we have voted to reinstate Carl and waive all other past debts and at the same time waive the fifteen year requirement for Emeritus if by his termination that was interupted. In addition we recommend to you and the Institute that Carl Lloyd Aimes be reinstated and elected to Emeritus membership.
