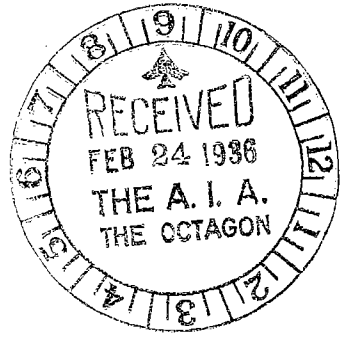

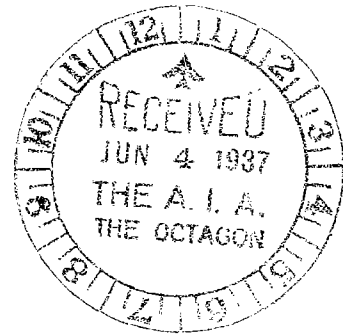

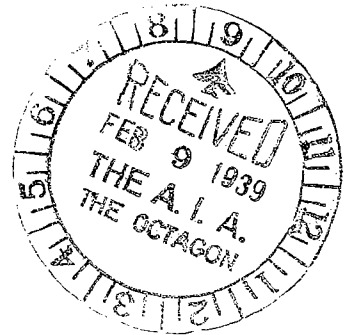

Included in his work for the National body has been Membership of the National Housing Committee and he is at the present time Chairman of the sub-committee on Small House problems of the National Housing Committee, A.I.A., and a member of the sub-committee on Cooperation with Government Agencies of the same National Committee.

Locally, Mr. Dalzell was also active for four years in the work of the Unification Committee, serving as Chairman for some time which work was brought to a successful conclusion a year or two ago, as a result of compromises which were agreed upon after long discussions and which Mr. Dalzell was always willing to make.

By his quiet and efficient manner and likable personality, Mr. Dalzell has always endeared himself to the Chapter and the Board feels that he is eminently fitted to receive the honor of advancement to Fellowship.





There was considerable unofficial discussion in our last chapter meeting concerning eligibility of members for Emeritus status, and the general discussion was that our association should not look with favor on granting this privilege to members who do not actively retire and remove their name from the letterhead or firm name as required by the State Registration Board.

A group of our individual members with no official comment or status felt that Mr. Dalzell should not be granted this privilege because he has not taken any active part in chapter affairs. Our records show that he has not been in attendance at any of our chapter meeting for a number of years. He appears to be such a man that has joined an association purely for the benefit of using the A.I.A. after his name.

I would not like to infer that any of these above matters are in any way concerned with Mr. Dalzell's ethics, but purely his relationship to the Institute.

Thank you for your letter of April 19th and the advice that Mr. Kenneth W. Dalzell, Sr., A.I.A., is a member in good standing in the Florida Central Chapter.

It is my understanding from reading your letter that the remarks in the second paragraph thereof do not apply to Mr. Dalzell. If this is not correct, will you let me know? In the application for Membership Emeritus, Mr. Dalzell has stated that he is "65 years of age, retired, and not engaged in the practice of architecture."

If that statement is correct, in view of his corporate membership in The Institute extending since 1920, he is eligible for election as a Member Emeritus. This is a right and privilege of every corporate member of the A.I.A., and unless there are any charges pending of unprofessional conduct, it would not be proper to consider any objections to an election for reasons of non-attendance at chapter meetings or of a similar nature.

Under these circumstances, it is our duty to refer Mr. Dalzell's request to The Committee on Membership for consideration at its next meeting on May 7th, unless we should hear from you in the interim that his statement as to his actual retirement from the practice of architecture is not a statement of fact.

Wish to inform you of several names on this list of 9/30/74;


