Dear Mr. Sprout:

Your letter of August 29th arrived on September 6th and I note your comments with regard to preparation of mominations of members assigned to your Chapter for advancement to Fellowship.

I am familiar with the procedure about which you write as to waiving the requirement that all members of your Board be required to sign each nomination; but this is the first reference I recall to waiving the requirement that each of those who do sign should furnish a letter on the numines's behalf.

In fact, I find in a letter written on April 8, 1959, and addressed to the President of your Association, and in accordance with the instructions of The Jury of Pellows at its meeting in 1959, the following request:

The Jury has noted that no supporting letters were received from the signers and sponsors of the nominations of Mosers. Goldberg and Stubbins, and of Mrs. Raymond: * * The Jury would appreciate attention to these matters and wishes to receive this supporting material by January 1, 1960, for consideration at the meeting in February."

I have made a check of the folders containing the nominations of Massachusetts Association members for Fellowship and find the following which may be of interest to you and the Committee charged with the preparation of nominations and supporting data:

Cascieri. Arcangelo - With the essistance of Mr. Chandler we now have executed questionnaires from all the signers, as required. There are fifteen, and none of them indicates that he does not know the naminae. However, only eight of these signers has sent in supporting letters.

In addition, we have only four other letters on Mr. Caseieri's behalf.

Goldberg, Carney - At the time of the first consideration of this nomination there were no letters from proposers as indicated in the paragraph quoted above. Since then letters have been received from four of the signers (fifteen signers in all). All but one returned executed de

questionnaires, and only two of them indicated they were not familiar with the nominee's accomplishments.

In addition, there are letters from ten members and non-members on Mr. Goldberg's behalf.

The 1961 consideration will be the third and last by the Jury.

Koch. Carl - The Jury of Fellows, at its meeting this year, instructed that a letter be sent to the President of your Association specifically requesting additional evidence supporting the claims for his outstanding achievements. So far, nothing has been received. This letter was sent to Mr. Whelan on February 18, 1960.

There are fifteen signers of Mr. Roch's nomination, eleven of whom returned executed questionnaires, and only one did advise that he does not know the nomines well enough to comment.

Supporting letters are received from nine of these signers.

Otherwise, we have one letter from a member of your Chapter, two letters from members located in other chapters, and two letters from non-members.

Reymond. Eleanor - Filed in 1958 and considered for the first time at the 1959 meeting of the Jury, at which time the Jury directed a letter be sent to your Chapter President as quoted on the first page of this letter. In November, 1959, that request was repeated to Francis B. Seliew, as Secretary for your Chapter's Honors and Awards Committee.

There are fifteen signers of Miss Raymond's nomination, only two of whom have indicated on questionnaires returned that they did not know her well enough to comment.

Subsequent to the request for letters from the supporters above mentioned, six of the proposers sent in letters.

Otherwise, one letter has been received from one other member of the Chapter; ten letters have been received from persons who are not members of The Institute.

The 1961 consideration will be the third and last of this nomination by The Jury of Fellows.

I am placing your letter of August 29th on the agende for the consideration of The Jury of Fellows at its next meeting in 1961, with the request for any further instructions which they may wish to give me in view of your statements.
