4. (c) After graduating from Robert E. Lee High School, Jacksonville, Florida, in June, 1928, I entered the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, Massachusetts in June, 1928. I continued there, studying Architecture through June, 1930.

Worked in office of Thomas Hixon, Architect in Boston, Massachusetts while attending M. I. T.

Went to work for Marsh & Saxelbye, Architects in Jacksonville, Florida in June, 1930 and continued there as Architectural Draftsman through June, 1933.

Worked for Rudolph Weaver, Architect for the State Board of Control, In Gainesville, Florida and also for Guy Fulton, Architect, Gainesville, Florida as Designer and Draftsman through June and Summer of 1933.

Went back to work for Marsh & Saxelbye, Architects, Jacksonville, Florida in the fall of 1933. I worked with them through June 1934 again as a draftsman and designer. I also supervised work and wrote specifications for them.

From July 1934, through July, 1936 I worked for the Home Owners' Loan Corporation, Jacksonville, Florida as Reconditioning Inspector and Supervisor in their Reconditioning Department. This work included writing specifications, drawing plans, and supervising construction work.

Resigned the above position in June, 1936 to form Architectural Firm of Hopkins & Huddleston as partner.
