Dear Mr. Klawiter:

We have duly received your letter of November 9th, and a reply has been delayed due to the fall meetings of the Board of Directors, held in Memphis, Tenn., November 13 to 16.

If you decide to resign your Institute membership, due to the uncertainty of your permanent location, this can be arranged, effective December 31, 1929, and action can be taken on your resignation at the next meeting of the Executive Committee, which will probably be held in February.

Then, when you have located permanently, you can be reinstated to membership, merely upon your written application, through the Secretary of the Chapter of which you were a member at the time of your resignation, and with the approval of the Chapter. Inasmuch as you are resigning as a member in good standing, this would be a matter of form, only.

On the other hand, you can transfer your Chapter membership to the Wisconsin Chapter, and maintain your membership there until such time as you leave Milwaukee, which would make your professional affiliation continuous. Naturally, we would prefer to have you follow this course.

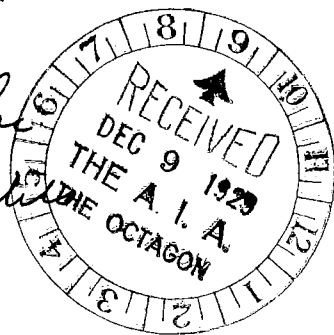
