June, 1944, transferred to the Office, Director of Plans and Operations, A.S.F. and appointed Chief of Planning Section to determine future requirements for all types of Army installations in the U.S. Prepared and published, September, 1945, a Post War Plan for the Army of the U.S., which was approved by the Chief of Staff, U.S. Army. Placed on inactive status December, 1945, with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel and awarded the Army Commendation Medal.
