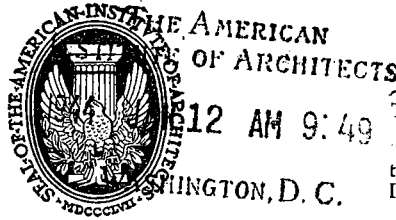

NOTICE OF SUSPENSION OF MEMBERSHIP
