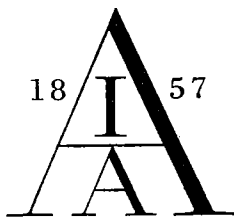

In response to your inquiry of September 5th with regard to the above applicant, I am glad to be able to report that the application is now complete and Mrs. Langhorst's election will become effective as of September 17. Notices will be mailed in due course.

With regard to the record, you state that the application was forwarded to us on April 17, 1956. However, we find that while the Northern California Chapter Executive Committee acted on this application at its meeting on April 17th, it was not forwarded to The Institute until June 14th, when it accompanied the notice of the Chapter's favorable action signed by Rex W. Allen, Secretary, and dated June 14. The application actually arrived at The Institute on June 18th.
