



In response to your inquiry of September 5th with regard to the above applicant, I am glad to be able to report that the application is now complete and Mrs. Langhorst's election will become effective as of September 17. Notices will be mailed in due course.

With regard to the record, you state that the application was forwarded to us on April 17, 1956. In reviewing Lois' file we find she was admitted to AIA membership in January 1960. She was granted a \$2000 AIA Scholarship Grant in 1963, and received dues waivers at AIA, CCAIA and chapter for the years 1965 and 1966. Notification of resignation was dated January 1, 1967.

The Executive Committee reviewed the Langhorst case at yesterday's meeting and could find no compelling reason for granting her request since she had never participated actively at the local level.

The application is forwarded to you without Chapter action inasmuch as her contribution at the National level may suggest approval of your part. The Chapter will accept whatever decision you render.
