



Explanation of Architectural Problems and Solution:

The Texas Children's Hospital was planned simultaneously with an adjoining General Hospital, to use with the latter as "Joint Facilities" such services as Surgery, X-Ray, Laboratory and Administration. The combined sites required that these services be located in a Connecting Link between the two hospitals. Access streets served to establish orientation, resulting in a due west front for Texas Children's Hospital.

The solution was a two-wing plan, with a central core connecting with the "Joint Facilities". The West and East Elevations were protected by precast concrete sun shades suspended from eight foot wide cantilevered canopies, permitting large glass walls above the two foot high sills enclosing air conditioning lines and blower units.

Milton Foy Martin, born in Texas, 1914, Bachelor of Architecture Degree, Texas A & M College, 1936. U. S. Army Engineers, 1940-1946; private practice until 1955; partnership with George W. Rustay until present.

Designed Texas Children's Hospital as Individual Practitioner 1951, Calhoun County Court House, Port Lavaca, Texas, 1957 and First Church of Christ, Scientist, Houston, Texas, 1960 as partner in firm of Rustay & Martin, Architects.
