This suspension is effective as of December 31, 1947. The sending of this notice has been delayed with the earnest wish that you might take some action in the matter.



PASSES ON



Services were conducted Saturday for Irving L. Osgood, renowned architect and designer of many notable Southland buildings, who had been a resident of Beverly Hills since 1924. Mr. Osgood leaves his wife, Harriet, of 311 N. Oakhurst Drive.

Funeral services for Irving L. Osgood, prominent architect and designer of many outstanding buildings here, were conducted at Pierce Bros. Beverly Hills Mortuary on Saturday, followed by interment in Inglewood cemetery. Services were read by Girard Baker.

For 22 years a resident of Beverly Hills, Mr. Osgood designed such famous buildings as Coulter's and the Richfield Oil building among many others, during his long affiliation with Stiles O. Clements. In addition, Mr. Osgood was for some time art designer for Warner Bros. studios.

Born in Oakland, Mr. Osgood graduated from the University of Pennsylvania and lived in New York for 10 years before coming to California. He was connected with Grosvenor Atterbury, famed architectural firm, in the eastern city. Mr. Osgood was a member of the American Institute of Architects.

Mr. Osgood is survived by his wife, Harriet, of 311 N. Oakhurst Drive, a son, Robert, and two daughters, Mrs. Arthur Honicky of Cleveland, Ohio, and Mrs. Robert Herbert of Boston, and two granddaughters. He also leaves a sister, Mrs. Wilbur Ballenger of Rosemead, and two brothers, Ernest and Earle Oskood, both of Glendale.
