



I GIVE YOU OUR WORD, THIS IS THE FIRST LOST SHIPMENT OUT OF SEVERAL THOUSAND.

WE KNOW WE ARE NOT QUITE AS WORTHLESS AS MISS HENKEL PAINTS US AND WANT TO ASSURE YOU THAT EVERY EFFORT IS BEING MADE TO GET YOU AN A.I.A. SIGN DELIVERED IN GOOD CONDITION.

IT SEEMS THAT OUR INEFFICIENCY HAS BEEN IN OUR CORRESPOND-ENCE RATHER THAN OUR PURSUIT OF LOST SHIPMENTS. I AM SURE THAT WE SHOULD HAVE KEPT YOU POSTED AS TO OUR EFFORTS TO LOCATE, NOT ONLY THE FIRST SIGN WE SHIPPED BUT ALSO THE SECOND ONE.

THE ONLY CONCRETE INFORMATION WE HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN OBTAINING COMES FROM MR. SANZ, DATED MAY 8, 1958 AND NOT FROM RAILWAY EXPRESS. WE RECEIVED THE LETTER TODAY IN WHICH IS STATED:

Valencia Baxt informed me that this package was supposed to have eeen received in Puerto Rico on October 29, 1957 on the steamship "Frivour" of the Borinquen Steamship Company, trip #1.

IT SEEMS THAT THIS STEAMSHIP COMPANY WAS DECLARED EANK-RUPT AFTER THIS TRIP AND THAT STRIKES AND OTHER DIFFICUL-TIES UNABLED THEM TO MAKE DELIVERY OF THE MERCHANDISE INCLUDED IN THAT SHIPMENT AND THAT THIS SIGN WAS LISTED AS LOST.

SINCE THE SIGN HAS EEEN DELIVERED IN SUCH EAD CONDITIONS, I CANNOT, OF COURSE, ACCEPT IT AND I HEREBY NOTIFY YOU SO THAT YOU MAY MAKE THE NECESSARY CLAIMS TO WHOEVER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL THIS TROUBLE. I AM ALSO SENDING OUT THE NECESSARY BLANKS OF CLAIM WITH REGARDS TO THIS DELIVERY.

Urban Design Nominee has pioneered in efforts to bring excellence to design in Puerto Rico emphasizing use of local materials and integration of traditional and historical architectural themes and art works in contemporary design of particular interest in his work on industrial and commercial design.

Nominee was one of the prime moving forces in the creation of a school of architecture in Puerto Rico.

Nominee has been a prime force in the institutionalization of the profession in Puerto Rico, both through his efforts to revitalize the Puerto Rico Institute of Architects as well as through his initiative that resulted in the establishermen of the local AIA Chapter, of which he was the first President. He has worked tirelessly in numerous government and private commissions to improve the image of the profession in the community.

Nominee has served in numerous governmental commissions related with the profession, notably as President of the Board of Examiners for Architects, Engineers and Surveyors. He has been active in the preservation of areas of historic interest, and as President of the local AIA Chapter created and nurture the Urban Design Committee that worked on the concept of a new Central City Area that may soon become a reality.

Nominee has been active in developing criteria for the preservation of historic areas, notably in Ponce, Puerto Rico, and has designed several successful examples of historic restorations.

Nominee has been one of the strongest forces behind the idea to develop a new City Center for San Juan. Has designed several monecring projects in the creation of urban environments designed around publics plaza spaces.
