Residence of Irving L. Gelder



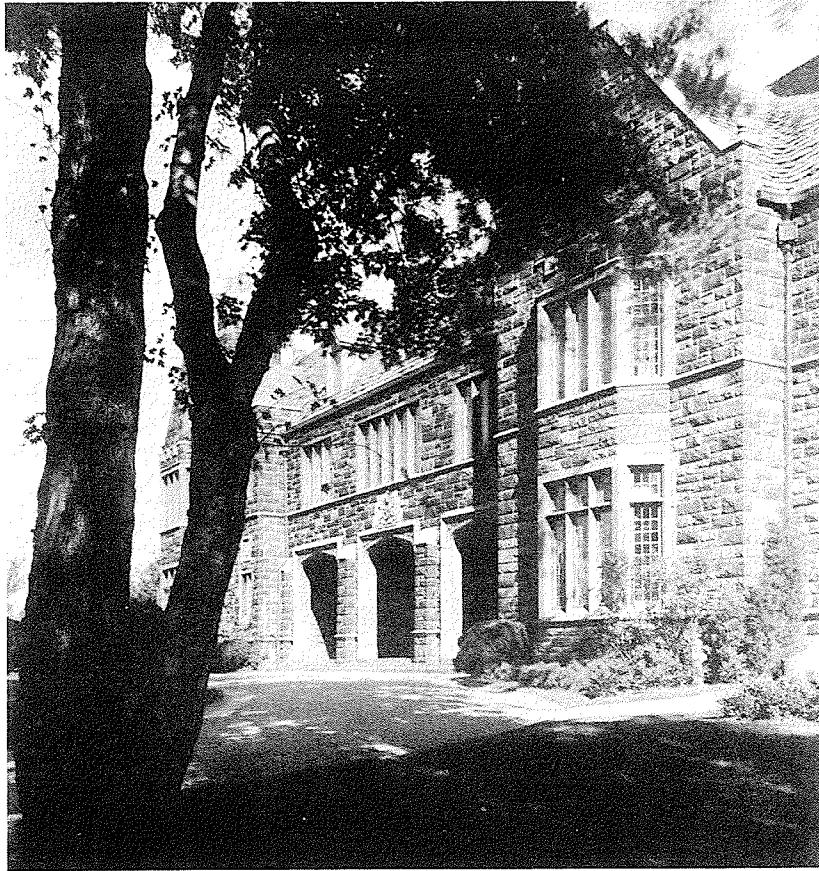
