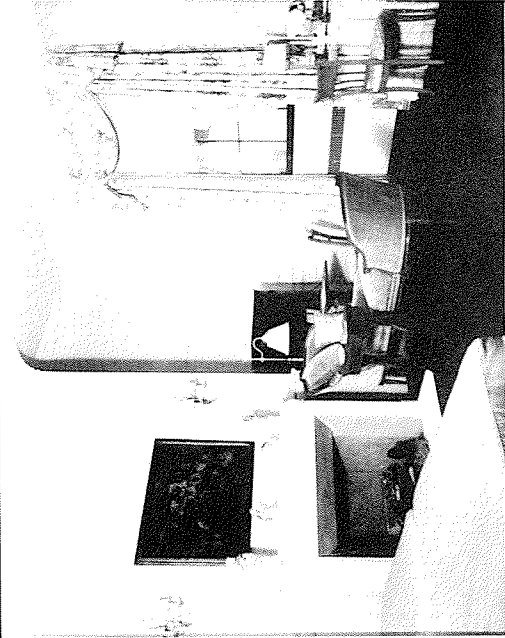

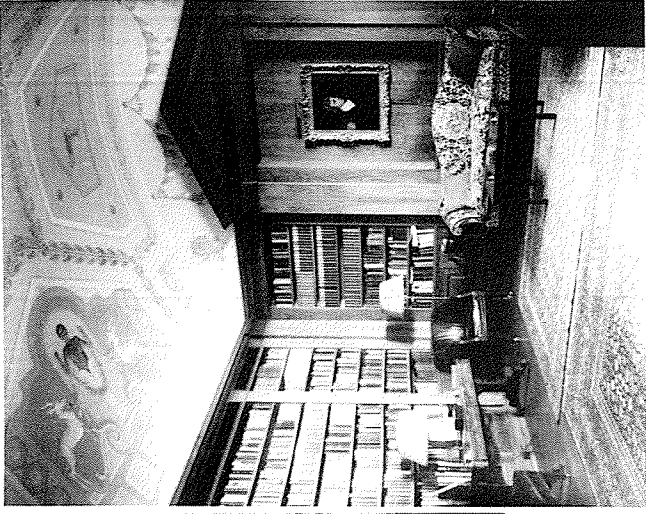




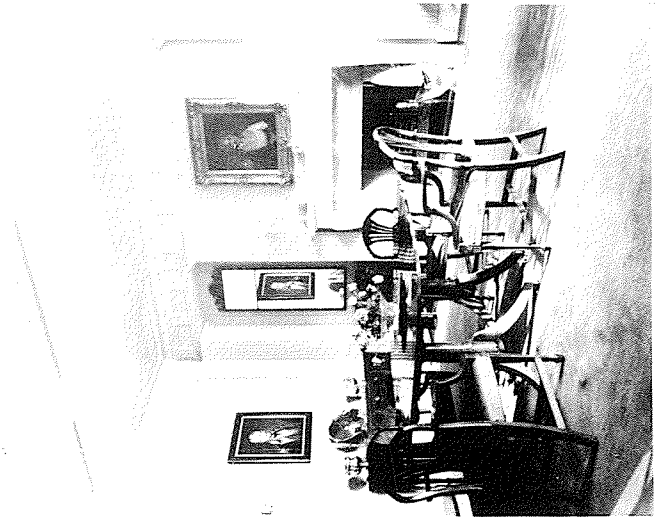
STREET ELEVATION

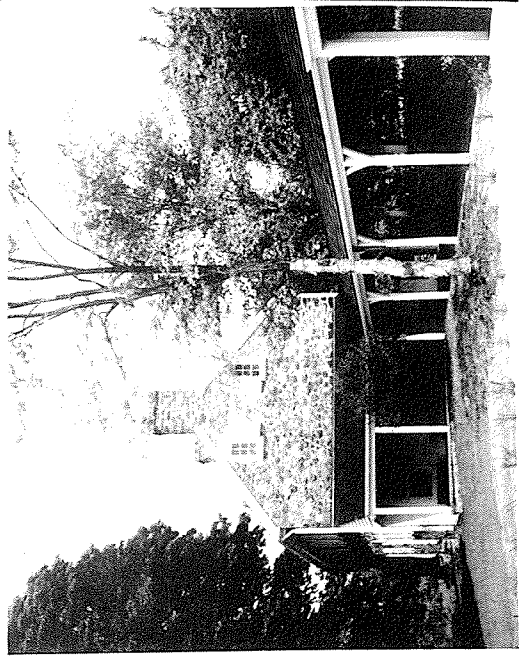
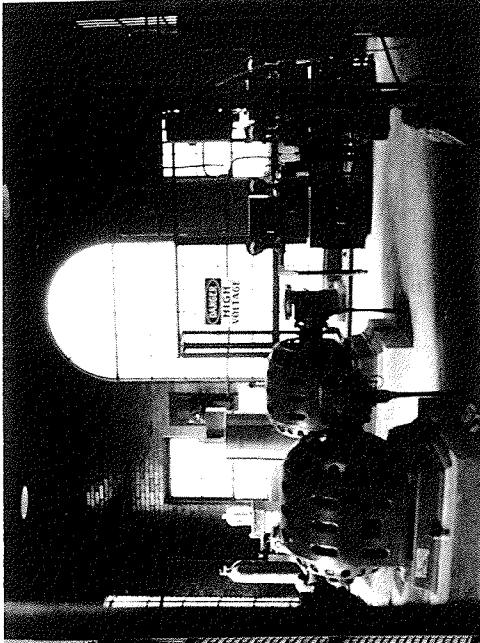




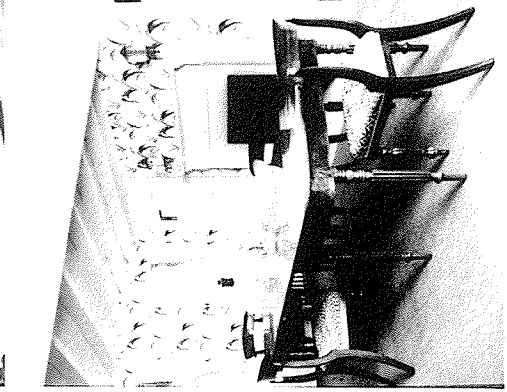
FRONT ELEVATION

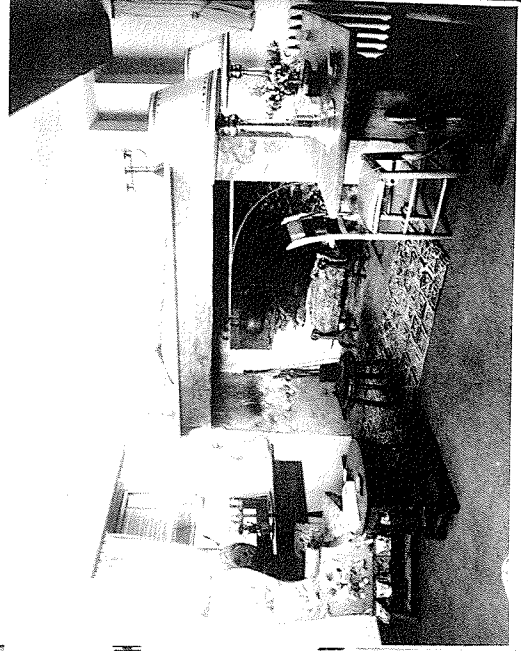
