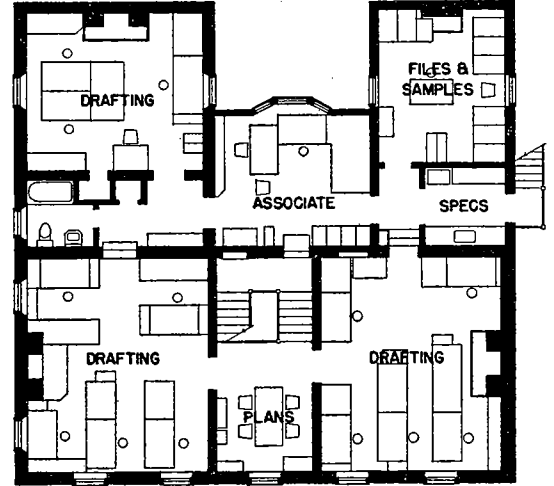

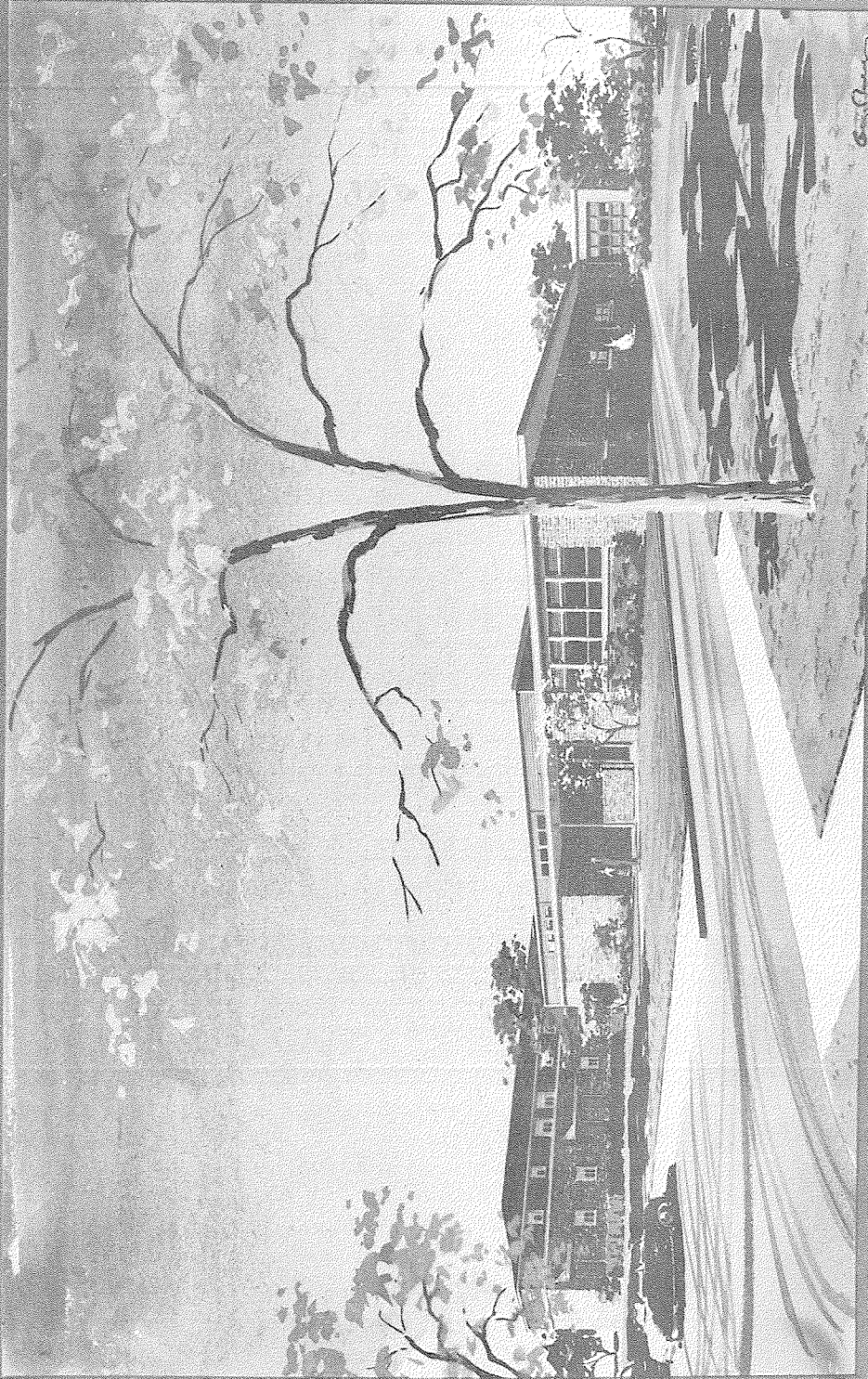

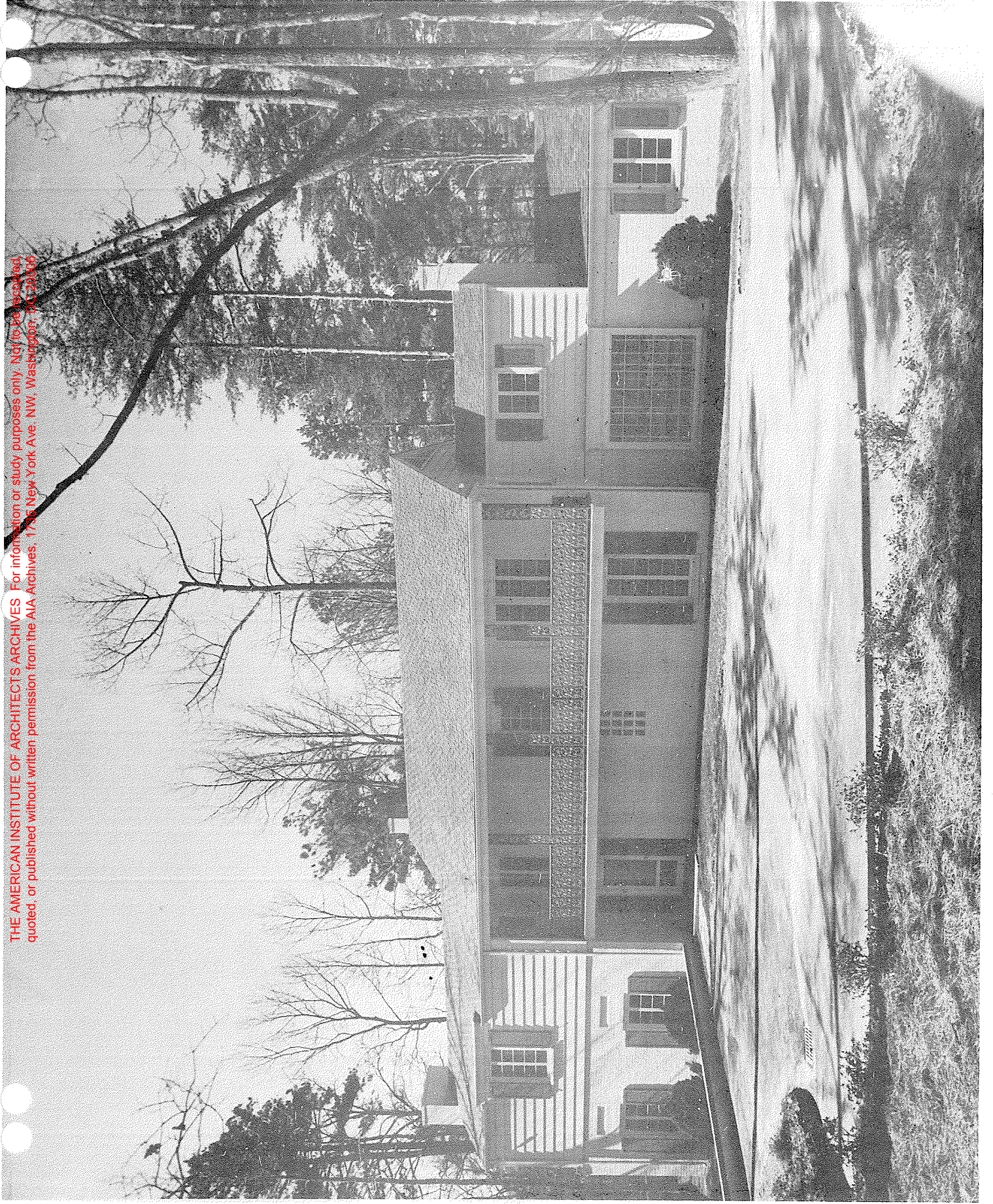

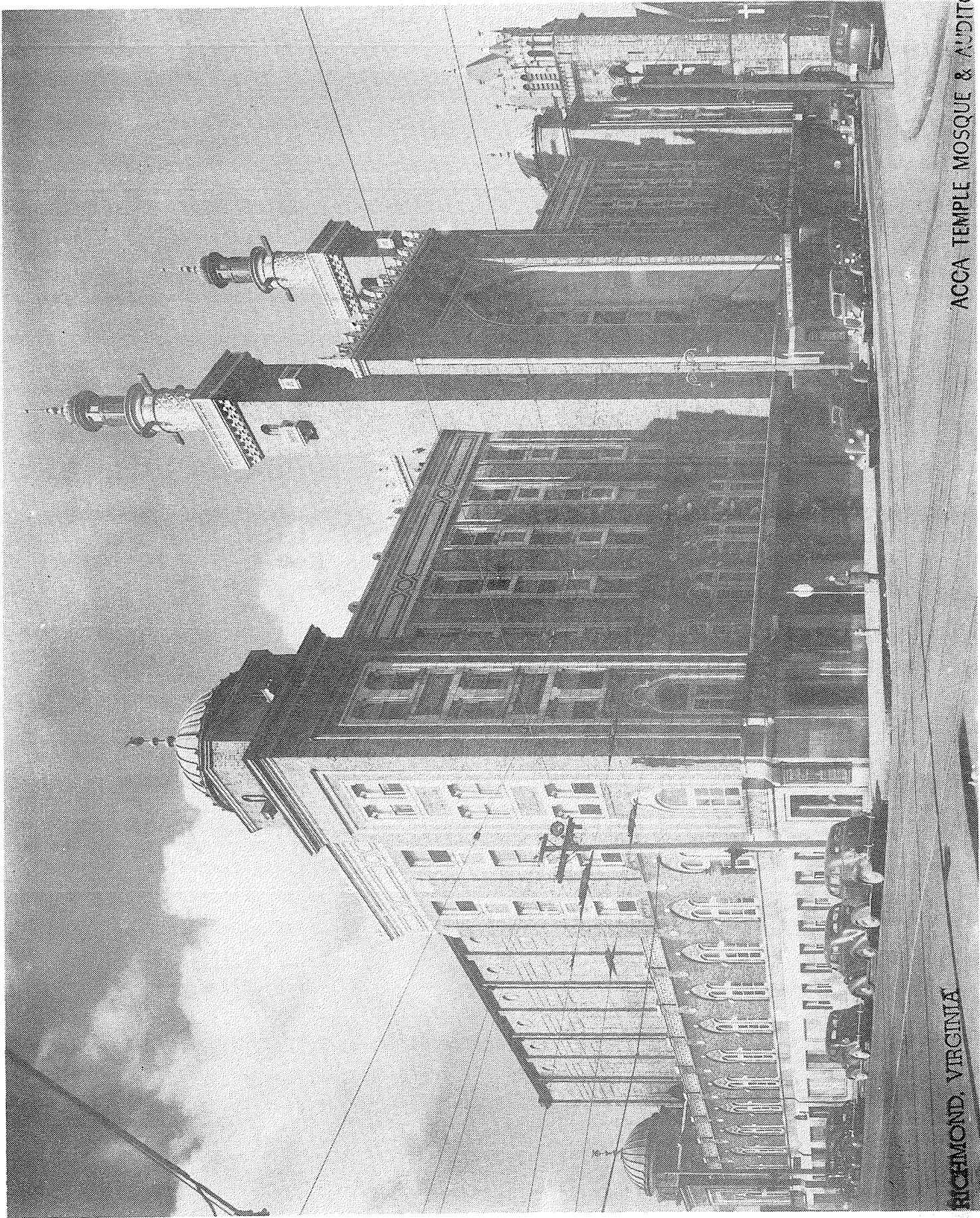

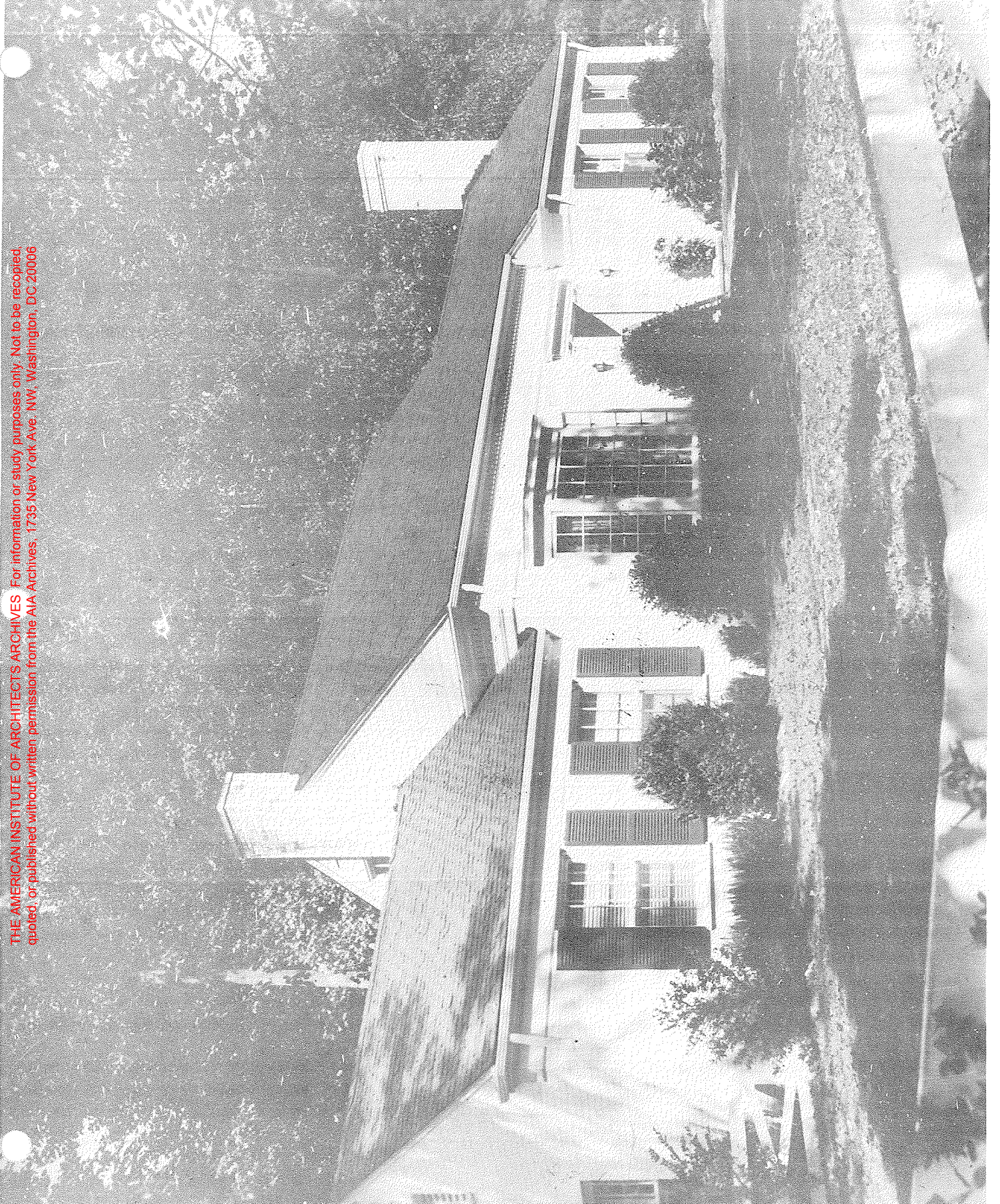

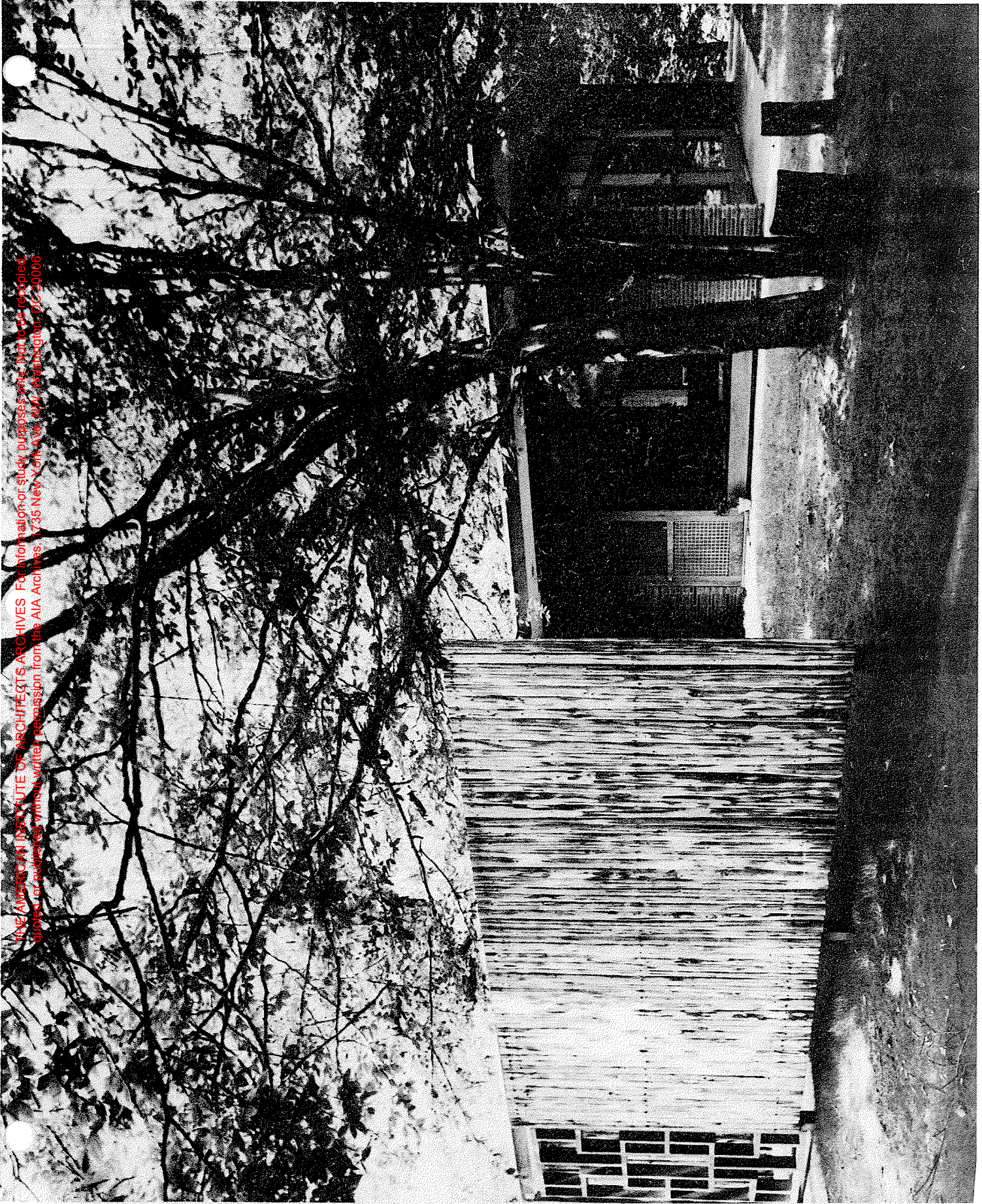

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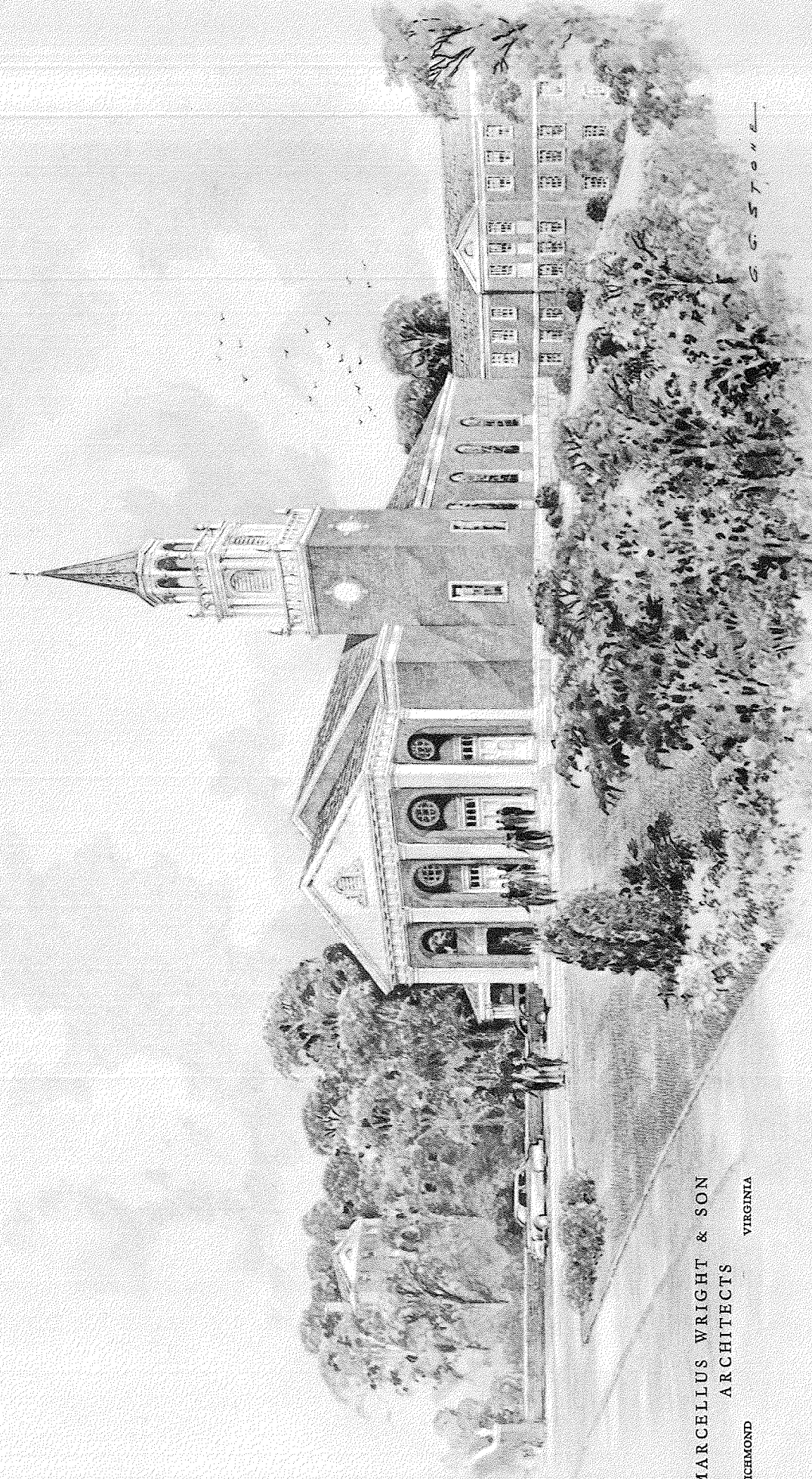

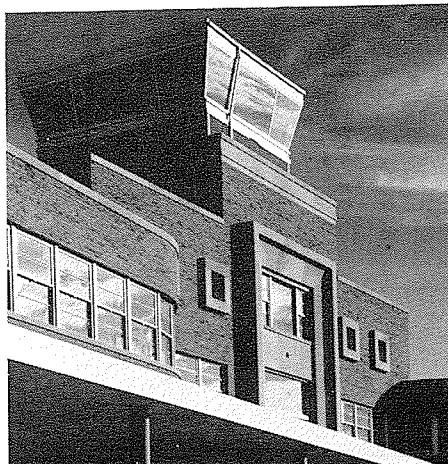

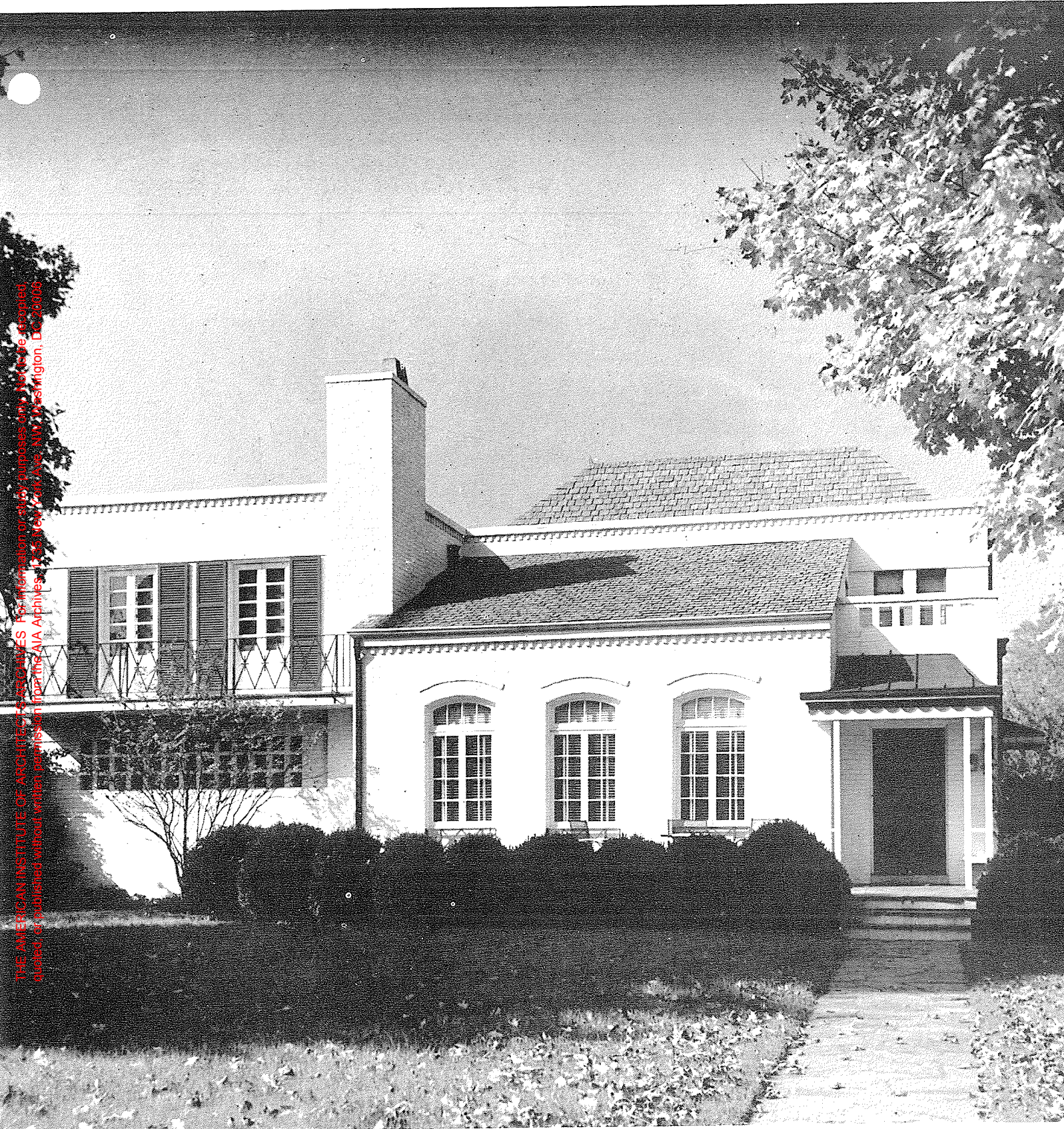

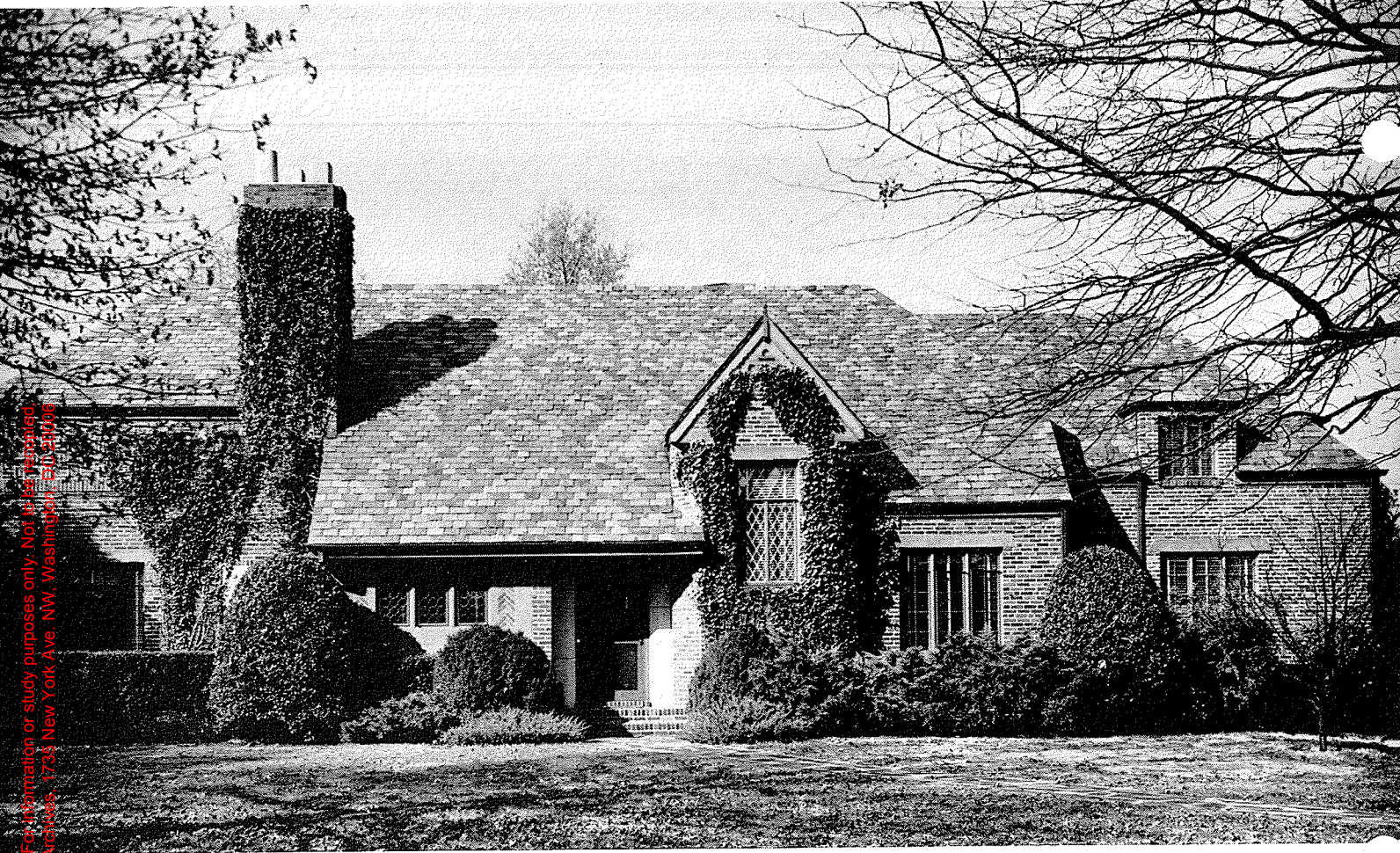


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Painted brick residence, Hampton Gardens, Richmond, Virginia. Note use of brick parapets, brick cornices and brick wall penetrations.

Regardless of one's design philosophy, it has always been agreed that "to do less than one could with the material at hand has always produced inferior work". It is considered, in the Virginia area, that the natural formations of red clay banks, coupled with the skill of the brick foundries, has produced a building material which, for most exterior uses, has so far not been excelled. The varying subtle shades and textures available in brick give the designer the widest possible range to his talents.

The continuity of the use of this material, so long as it serves the need so admirably, further allows the archi-

tectural designer to express himself most freely, as called for in so many of the new needs, and still gain client acceptance of his work. Any harsh or revolutionary change is hard to assimilate in any field, but an airport administration building could never honestly be solved by resource to shapes and forms of buildings which served our Colonial ancestors well. The fortuitous circumstance that maintains one surface material with such excellence provides the designer with an automatic continuity, while giving him all the delightful warmth of color and texture that many modern requirements demand, but seldom have.
