Growing out of an earlier Register of architects qualified for public works, The Roster provides at The Octagon an accurate, current record of the qualifications and achievements of members of the profession. It allows a positive and helpful response to requests for factual information on architects, and in that way constitutes a service to the profession.

The American Institute of Architects assumes no responsibility for the accuracy of statements made in this Questionnaire. The obligation to maintain this record as a current description of an architectural firm rests with the firm, and supplementary record forms are available for this purpose.




RESIDENCE OF JAMES W. MULLEN, II RICHMOND, VIRGINIA






Detail of display window. Unadorned roman brickwork in stack bond offers modern setting for merchandise.






Close-up of brickwork flanking entrance shows how deeply raked mortar joints accentuate roman brick.








Painted brick residence, Hampton Gardens, Richmond, Virginia. Note use of brick parapets, brick cornices and brick wall penetrations.

Regardless of one's design philosophy, it has always been agreed that "to do less than one could with the material at hand has always produced inferior work". It is considered, in the Virginia area, that the natural formations of red clay banks, coupled with the skill of the brick foundries, has produced a building material which, for most exterior uses, has so far not been excelled. The varying subtle shades and textures available in brick give the designer the widest possible range to his talents.

The continuity of the use of this material, so long as it serves the need so admirably, further allows the archi-

tectural designer to express himself most freely, as called for in so many of the new needs, and still gain client acceptance of his work. Any harsh or revolutionary change is hard to assimiliate in any field, but an airport administration building could never honestly be solved by resource to shapes and forms of buildings which served our Colonial ancestors well. The fortuitous circumstance that maintains one surface material with such excellence provides the designer with an automatic continuity, while giving him all the delightful warmth of color and texture that many modern requirements demand, but seldom have.
