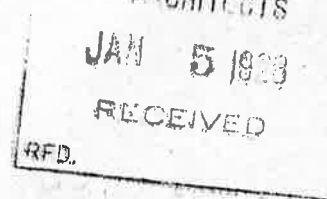

My dear Mr. Lockward:

This will acknowledge with regret your letter of January 3rd.

A resignation must come to the Institute through the member's Chapter under the procedure shown on the marked excerpt sent herewith.

Until such resignation is received we must continue to carry you as an Institute member in good standing.

We are sorry you feel as you do, and that the Ethics of the Institute are of so little force.

Surely the great majority of the Institute members observe the Ethics, which are merely accepted rules of good sportsmanship, and surely you must have had some unfortunate experience.

If there are members whom you know who are intentionally violating the Code of Ethics it is your duty to send their names to the Institute, or to the President of the New Jersey Chapter. This can be done for the purpose of an investigation and not of a filing of formal charges of unprofessional conduct.

Certainly it is true that the architectural profession would be much worse off without the Institute, and we believe it to be equally true that the Institute is no stronger and no better than its individual members make it.

Why not stick around for a while and at the same time insist that any of the Institute members you know who are not playing the game squarely either change their methods or get out of the Institute.
