The 96,000+ members of the American Institute of Architects (AIA) have connected the power of design in the spaces where we live, work, learn and play for over 167 years. Today, as part of the AIA Leadership Summit, architects among your constituency will be traveling to the national capital to directly advocate for legislation impacting the profession. This year's AIA Lobby Day participants will amplify their collective support for two key, bipartisan policy priorities: design freedom and resilience.

No design style is inherently more or less valuable than any other. As such, AIA stands firmly against any federal mandate on architectural design.
