1 Institute Honor Awards for Regional & Urban Design

Judging Criteria

Each entry is judged for the success with which the project has met its individual requirements. Entries are weighed individually and not in competition with each other.

Design achievement can be evidenced by the exploration of new approaches to ecological planning, urban form, or sensitive reinforcement of successful historical development patterns.

Entries should integrate the engagement of ecological issues by describing (preferably with graphics) how the design addresses the *'triple bottom line'* – i.e. providing holistic solutions that simultaneously address environmental, social, and economic criteria. These include strategies that capture, collect, store, and distribute resident renewable resources and energies, while enhancing the quality of life and promoting social equity.

Entries may also exhibit improvements in the quality of life, the environment, and/or the technical advancement of urban systems.

Eligibility

Entrants:

- owners, individual practitioners, private design firms, public agencies, civic organizations, and public interest groups can nominate projects or programs in which they were involved
- a U.S.-licensed architect must be the author of the project
- submitting architects do not have to be the head of the team
- projects must credit every substantial contributor

Projects:

- urban design projects, planning programs, civic improvements, campus plans, environmental programs, redevelopment projects, or other similar projects and programs may be entered
- individual buildings are not eligible
- size and location of the project or program are not factors
- incomplete or ongoing projects or programs may be entered if a significant portion has been completed, implemented, or adopted by a local jurisdiction or authority

Entries must include:

- a 500-word project description, with design achievement details
- a 500-word sustainable design intent and innovation description, with details on how the project's strategies meet sustainability goals
- additional information to support energy strategies, community connectivity metrics, water data, and material choices
- project images—in a single PDF file, 10 MB and 26 pages max

IMAGE UPLOAD FOR JURY REVIEW

- project images must be submitted in a single .PDF file not to exceed **10 MB** and a maximum of 26 pages
- it is the submitter's responsibility to make sure the architect's name and/or firm name is not revealed on any of the images, plans, or narratives - failure to follow this requirement will automatically disqualify the entry
- include drawings, images, models, and/or sketches showing urban design issues and key urban design concepts (emphasizing process and implementation)
- provide additional conceptual diagrams and site plans (including North arrow) sufficient to illustrate the complete project

Additional Tips

- composite pages are acceptable
- text/notes on images/drawings are allowed
- indicate the scale used on any drawings or plans
- any material you feel relevant to explain your project should be included within your submission - external links to documents (comprehensive master plans, civic reports, etc.) are an acceptable method of supplying additional material should you feel it is significant and vital for the jury to examine, but they are not required to review these items
- use of the maximum page limit is strongly recommended
- consistent use of either a horizontal or portrait landscape is encouraged throughout the submission
