#### CATEGORY DESCRIPTIONS

#### Category A | Stellar Design

Submissions in this category must exhibit exemplary design and demonstrate innovations in practices and technologies critical in the design process which result in positively impacting project delivery, construction, occupancy and operations. In addition to the General Criteria, submissions may include:

- · Advancement in the theory and practice of architecture through the innovative use of technology and/or progressive methods;
- Emphasis of design expertise utilizing advanced technologies and/or progressive methods, but not being determined, dictated, or limited by them;
- Architectural expression that could not have been fully realized without specific technologies or methods;
- · Demonstration of new capabilities and achievements incorporating outstanding programming, design, fabrication, construction and/or operation;
- Leveraging advanced/progressive construction and materials technologies to enable high performance operation of the building.

#### Category B | Project Delivery & Construction Administration Excellence

Submissions in this category must exhibit outstanding examples of innovations in collaboration at any stage of, if not the entire, project delivery - including integrating planning, design, construction contract administration, construction and operations - to fulfill project goals. In addition to the General Criteria, Project Delivery Excellence submissions may include:

- · Progressive contractual relationships to advance the project delivery;
- New or alternative forms of collaboration between project stakeholders; New, innovative forms of construction contract administration;
- Preservation or enhancement of design intent with lower delivery costs;
- Opportunities for advances in the client's operations and facility management duties due to the resulting project delivery innovations.

#### Category C | Project Lifecycle Performance

Submissions in this category must exhibit outstanding examples of how innovations in design, project delivery and construction have resulted in measurable positive results in the project's occupancy and operations. In addition to the General Criteria, Project Lifecycle Performance submissions

- Clear definition of performance criteria and baselines, based on the original design/project delivery intent/goals, with documentation of performance results and analysis over time (a minimum of 2 years);
- Performance factors may include:
  - a. Reduction in consumption of utilities and resources, such as electricity, water, or other consumables;
  - b. On-site electrical generation through solar, wind or other technology/methods;
  - c. Advanced waste management (ex: recycling, composting or grey water systems);
  - d. Carbon footprint reductions due to sustainable design and operations strategies;
  - e. Resiliency to severe climatic conditions, such as flooding, drought or wild fire;
- Demonstrations of the uses of advanced technologies and project delivery data to address operations and ongoing lifecycle management and maintenance.

#### Category D | Practice-based or Academic Research, Curriculum or Applied Technology Development

Submissions in this category must exhibit outstanding new practice-based or academic research initiatives, curriculum development or applied technology development which incorporate innovative methodologies and technologies addressing design, project delivery, construction and/or operations. In addition to the General Criteria, submissions should include:

- Practice-based or academic initiatives employing progressive practices, innovative processes or advanced technologies, or any combination thereof, to achieve design intent realization, gains in efficiency, productivity or sustainability;
- Development of computing technology including mobile, cloud or desktop-based platforms applied to progressive practice methodologies
  addressing design, project delivery, construction and/or operations, including but not limited to:
  - a. The use or leverage of 'big data';
  - b. The implementation of data interoperability. Opportunities where open standards were used to achieve data interoperability across multiple technology platforms are HIGHLY encouraged;
  - c. Stand-alone applications or plug-ins to existing platforms.
- Development of innovative building technology improving project construction and/or operations;
- Documentation on the impacts of resulting research or curriculum to practice, project delivery, construction and/or operations;
- Entries need not be built. However, the feasibility of the innovations in practice, process and/or technology and their effect on the proposed project must be provided.

#### Category E | Exemplary use in a Small Firm

Submissions in this category must exhibit exemplary improvements through application of progressive practices, innovative processes and advanced technologies in a firm of 10 or fewer members, at any stage(s) of the overall process of project feasibility assessment, programming, design, documentation, procurement, construction and operation. In addition to the General Awards Criteria, submission should include:

• Documentation explaining how the improvements allow the small firm to practice at a 'higher level', tackling projects of large scale and/or complexity that others may feel are reserved only for larger practices.
