The Small Project Practitioners (SPP) Knowledge Community presents the thirteenth annual Small Project Award Program to recognize the work of small project practitioners and to promote excellence in small project design. This Award Program strives to raise public awareness of the value and design excellence that architects bring to all project types, including renovations and additions, no matter the limits of size and budget. This year's Small Project Award theme, REFLECTION, will recognize projects that engage the idea of REFLECTION and incorporate concepts and elements relating to this theme. The theme is intentionally open-ended to encourage wide interpretation.

Recognition

Award winning projects will be recognized in AIA publications and electronic media, including the SPP REVIEW and website. Projects will also be displayed at the 2017 AIA National Convention and Design Exposition. Information will be provided to Award Recipients regarding board layout.

Eligibility


- · Open to architects licensed in the United States.
- Built projects must have been completed after January 1, 2013.
- · There is no requirement for professional photography.
- Any sized firm may submit a project.
- Maximum of four entries per firm (a single project may be entered in two different categories with applicable fees for each entry).

Deadline and Entry Fees

- The deadline for submission completion is November 14, 2016 <u>before</u> 5:00 PM Eastern. All deadlines are strictly observed.
- Below is the list of submission entry fees. All entry fees are non-refundable
 - AIA Members: \$175 for each entry,
 - Nonmembers: \$300 for each entry

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

Submission Requirements

Any identification of the architect or firm appearing on any submitted images shall cause the entry to be disqualified. Failure to fully comply with all submission requirements shall cause the entry to be disqualified.

Slides

- Submissions may not exceed 10MB and must include no more than ten (10) slides arranged in the order you wish them viewed. Submissions with more than 10 slides will be immediately disqualified. A composition of drawings, images, and other illustrations may constitute one (1) slide given that said composition complies with all other submission requirements.
- Documentation to describe the project context, special considerations, and innovative design.
- Site Plan, Floor Plan(s), Sections and Elevations as appropriate to project type including North arrow and graphic scale.
- Slide Format: Slides are to be submitted in a single bound PDF file (no more than 10 slide pages). PDF files are to be high quality. Each slide is to be no larger than 1600 x 1200 pixels at 300dpi.

Photography Requirements

- Image Quality: Photos enable the jury to evaluate your project. An award cannot be made to a project if its relevant details cannot be determined through the submission material. Please note that submissions will be reviewed by jurors on a computer screen.
- Image Editing: Images may be edited to improve contrast ratio and color balance. Images may also be cropped, but they may not be edited to alter architectural elements or context. Images identifying authorship must be edited to retain the anonymity of the author. Images may be black and white, sepia or color but may not be colorized black and white images. Images should represent the project, as it exists in the built environment. Artistic composition must not confuse the jury as to the nature of the project.

Submission Suggestions | Hints for Success

- Jurors desire to see project context how it fits into the environment or surroundings. At least one photo should show the project's relationship to its surroundings
- Site plans, floor plans, elevations, and sections should be used when appropriate to help describe the project
- Take advantage of the 2017 Reflection theme. Jury members will be instructed to pay close attention to submissions that clearly present innovative design strategies that capitalize on project constraints or limitations. Additionally, jurors will want to see either an unusual approach to a common problem, or a straightforward solution masterfully executed
- Photography should be of good quality and communication the project well. Professional photography is not required
- Presentation is important. Organize your entry into a coherent presentation. Although compositions of drawings and images are permitted, simple layouts, and single images often prove most effective
- Information should not be too small or illegible.
- Use direct, simple language for description. Avoid Archi-speak
- Emphasize one or two strong points about the project..
- Include a single sentence anecdote of description that helps the jury remember your submission
- Sometimes it may be better to enter a single object from a project rather than the project in its entirety.
- · You may enter different objects from the same project individually

The submission process must be completed prior to 4:59:59 p.m. Eastern Time, November 14, 2016. Please allow time for uploading your submission materials - no exceptions to the deadline will be made.
