

Welcome to the 2017 AIA/AAH Healthcare Designs Awards

The AIA/AAH Design Awards showcase the best of healthcare building design, healthcare planning and healthcare design-oriented research. The awards highlight the trends of healthcare facilities and the future direction of these facilities. Projects should exhibit conceptual strength that solve aesthetic, civic, urban, and social concerns as well as the requisite functional and sustainability concerns of a hospital. The American Institute of Architects (AIA) and the Academy of Architecture for Health (AAH) will recognize awarded projects and respective firms for their contribution to the healthcare environment at the AIA/ACHA Summer Leadership Summit and AIA National Convention. In addition, the projects will be featured in the AIA/AAH healthcare design awards publication.

Eligibility

- Because this is a program that will evaluate modern trends in healthcare design, projects submitted must have been completed after January 1, 2012.
- Projects may be re-submitted in future year's competitions, as long as they still meet the submission requirements. Projects that have received an AIA/AAH award are not eligible for resubmission in the same category.
- Projects may be located anywhere in the world, but must have been designed by an architect licensed in the United States or in one of its territories at the time of the project's completion. "Completion" is synonymous with "substantial completion" as defined in the standard AIA documents governing construction.
- The submitting architect may qualify as a member of a design team, whether or not serving as the head of the team. When one architect is not the sole author, all other participants contributing substantially to the design of the project must be given credit as part of the submission, regardless of professional discipline.
- For multiple building projects, the architect submitting the project (or portion thereof) shall offer detailed evidence of authorship of each portion of the project.
- Any project that credits any 2017 AIA/AAH Healthcare Design Awards jury member or their firm as architect, associate architect, consultant, or client is ineligible and will be disqualified if submitted.
- Communication with 2017 AIA/AAH Healthcare Design Awards jurors by the entrants is inappropriate. All architects of award-winning projects will be required to verify they had no written or verbal communication with any 2017 AIA/AAH Healthcare Design Awards juror regarding any submitted project from the time of submittal to completion of the jury process.

Award recipient entries become the property of the AIA and will be retained in the collections of the AIA Library and Archives.

Award winners are announced and presented at the AIA AAH/ACHA Summer Leadership Summit held in Chicago each July. They will also be published on the AIA website and in the AIA Supplement in November. AIA/AAH are committed to continuing to expand coverage of the winning entries in 2017 and beyond.

Additionally, winning entries will be published in the case study database developed and updated by the AAH Research Committee and will be accessible from the website. Case studies will include previous winners and updated with future winners to serve for research and promote best practices.

General Submission Guidelines

1. Project authorship will remain concealed throughout the deliberations of the jury. If the authorship is revealed on any of the images, plans, or narrative, the entry will be disqualified. However, project identity and location are acceptable.
2. The submission deadline date (Monday, March 13, 2017 at 4:59:59 pm Eastern Time) will be strictly observed; no exceptions will be made. No entry fee will be refunded for entries that are disqualified, late, or not completed.

3. Rights to photos, digital images, and plans must be cleared for publication by the entrant. Entrants are responsible for any royalties or copyright photography fees. Before entering, entrants must have the owner's approval to submit the project. Owners must be informed of potential site visits and the significant recognition in the media should the project receive an award.

Deadline and Entry Fees


- The deadline for submission completion is March 13, 2017 **before 5:00 PM Eastern**. All deadlines are strictly observed.
- The **non-refundable** entry fee for this program is \$450 for members and \$500 for non-members.
- Please review the [Submission Preview](#) carefully before submitting your payment. You can go back and edit your submission until the deadline but no refunds will be issued.

- Upon the jury's final selection you will be contacted to provide high-resolution images. Without these your project will not receive proper recognition. Winning submissions become the property of the AIA Library and Archives and will be used in an exhibit for the AIA National Convention.
- Please note that all material submitted will become the property of AIA/AAH and will not be returned. By submitting an entry, the firm agrees that all of the submitted material is cleared for release for use in publicity and publication. If necessary, AIA/AAH will contact the submitting firm for clarification or further information regarding their submission.

Your submission should include:

Provide a maximum of 15 images that best describe your project. Images may be photographs, renderings, and drawings.

It is suggested to include the following:

- A site plan, with north arrow, that shows the project in context. Clearly delineate between existing structures and the new project scope. Utilize before and after graphics if needed to put project in context.
- Diagrams and graphics that support the conceptual drivers and organization. These can be stacking diagrams, isometrics, sections or other images deemed appropriate by the design team.
- Ground floor plans and other key floors plans and building sections, if appropriate, to delineate program and departmental organization.
- Photographs that walk the viewer through the project. Convey the experience of the user and staff. Clearly label photographs or provide location thumbnails. Include before and after photos if appropriate.

Additional Tips

- Composite pages are acceptable.
- Text/notes on images/drawings are allowed.
- Consistent use of either a horizontal or portrait landscape is encouraged throughout the submission.
