



This will acknowledge receipt of a carbon copy form letter signed by your Secretary Harold McNeil, dated March 18th and addressed jointly to Robert E. and wallace M. Baxter, with reference to the listing of our firm name in the classified section of the local telephone directory.

Dear Mr. McMoil:

Herewith is copy of letter of March 22 from Mr. Robert M. Baxter, corporate member of The Institute assigned to the Florida South Chapter, tendering his resignation. Attached to it is a copy of his letter of March 22 to you concerning the reason for the resignation - nevely, the rule of The Institute against the listing of the name of a member in beldface type in the classified section of a telephone directory.

We also enclose a copy of a similar letter of resignation, of Harch 22, from Mr. Rellace M. Baxter, to which is attached a copy of his letter of March 22 to you.

These two resignations can be accepted on the date received at The Octagon - namely, March 24, 1948 - since both members have paid their Institute dues.

However, the Chapter may not wish to lose these two memberships, so we call to your attention the action of The Board of The Enstitute at its meeting last December in setting up a special Committee on Interpretations, of which Mr. Arthur Ward Archer, Regional Director of the Central States District, Commerce Trust Building, Kenses City, Missouri, is Chairsan.

That Committee is to make recommendations to The Board of The Institute at its next scoting - this coming June - with respect to certain previsions of the present Standards of Professional Practice, which, when literally interpreted, are regarded by some numbers as being too stringent.

We are sending a copy of this letter to Mesors. Rebert E. and Wellace M. Bezter, and to Mr. John L. Skinner, Regional Director of the South Atlentic District. This is done with the sole intent of being helpful, and with the request that you advise The Institute concerning the position of the Chapter in the matter.

The resignations can be accepted immediately if the Chapter so recommends; or they can be held until after the June sceting of The Institute Board, at which time the Committee on Interpretations, above mentioned, will make a report.
