- one-page, focusing on one or two aspects of the firm's submission (two-page letters will be removed from your file and not reviewed by the jury)
- on company letterhead (retired or Emeritus members may use personal stationery)
- signed
- uploaded as a PDF file into the system using the unique link provided to each letter writer prior to 5 pm Eastern on July 28, 2022.

There are no restrictions on the selection of references. However, please note that it is in a candidate's best interest to demonstrate a broad range of support and influence (e.g., geographic distribution; limit references from a single source such as a firm or committee).

It is the nominator's responsibility to contact the reference writers and establish if each is willing to act as a reference and to emphasize the importance of submitting a letter in a timely fashion.
