The American Institute of Architects (AIA) wants to thank the Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) for efforts (albeit unsuccessful) to reach an agreement with AIA on a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to establish and codify a formal Secretary's Award program. Although we had hoped to reach a successful outcome to these efforts, we certainly appreciate your consideration of our requests.

The American Institute of Architects (AIA) is committed to protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the public. Since 1857, this concern is central to all that we, as architects, do. AIA's over 92,000 members have worked to advance our nation's quality of life through design. From designing the next generation of energy-saving buildings to making our communities healthier and safer, architects play a central role in influencing and improving the built environment through their work. Housing is clearly a huge piece of the work we do.

The AIA/HUD Secretary's Award program, supported by the AIA Housing and Community Development Knowledge Community and managed by AIA and HUD staff, emphasizes the importance that affordable, accessible, and well-designed housing are not exclusive from each other. In 2020, AIA and HUD had 2 projects that were recognized for this honor considered across four categories. However, AIA is tightening its standards for these awards and was not able to reach the finish line with HUD on parameters for that work, moving forward.
