
Services will be held Saturday for the late Theodore "Ted" Criley Jr., a Claremont architect who died Saturday, September 15 at the age of 79.

"Ted was very much a gentleman but somewhat of a Bohemian," said Fred McDowell, his partner in a Claremont architecture firm for more than 20 years.

Mr. Criley was the architect for many local landmarks, including residence halls and a library addition at Scripps College; the master plan, an academic building and dormitory at Pitzer College; dormitories, an academic building and the president's house at Claremont McKenna College and an academic building and dormitories at the School of Theology.

Mr. Criley's handiwork can also be seen locally in the Society of Friends meeting house and education building; the education buildings at the Claremont Methodist Church; and the sanctuary and chapel of the Claremont United Church of Christ, Congregational. It is in that sanctuary, at the United Church of Christ, that Saturday's service will be held. "This (the CUCCC), I think, he was probably proudest of of all his project," Mr. McDowell said.

The service will be at 4 p.m. September 22.



Mr. Criley was born in Los Angeles in 1905 and went to elementary and high school in California, Missouri and France. He received his bachelor's degree in architecture from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1930 after also studying at the University of California.


