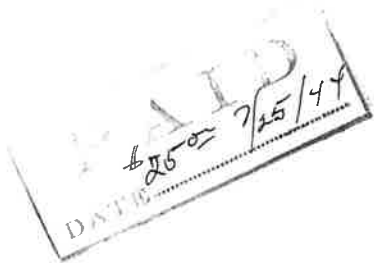


Thank you for your very kind letter of January 7. I would be most happy indeed, if I should qualify for election as a Member Emeritus in the Institute.
