

Dear Mr. Smith:

We hereby request waiver of all reinstatement charges to return our members Fred Rochlin, AIA, and Ephraim Baran, AIA, to full membership in the Institution.

On 17 January 1973 the firm forwarded a check in the amount of \$979.04 to the Octagon in payment of 1972 supplemental dues and the special \$10.00 assessment for Messrs. Rochlin and Baran. This check was lost between Los Angeles and Washington.

This payment has been received at the Octagon. However, a 28 March letter from Washington acknowledging receipt of the second check advised that there would be a reinstatement charge of \$88.00 maximum and \$10.00.minimum.

We feel this is unfair because the total 1972 obligation had been paid. Although admittedly late, it was sent in sufficient time to prevent the termination action. Only the inefficiency of the mails caused such action.

The good faith of Messrs. Rochlin and Baran has been further illustrated by their 16 March payment of the 1973 dues obligation.

Again, we urge your waiver of the reinstatement charges.
