

DIGEST OF THE CAREER AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF FRANCIS S. HAINES HONOLULU, HAWAII

GENERAL

Princeton architectural graduate, 1941; naval officer until 1946. Masters in architecture, M.I.T., 1948, working diligently as designer, then principal, making through his professional effort, design talent and business sense, probably the most capable architectural firm in Hawaii, serving the profession by establishing this high quality of output in Hawaii.

PUBLIC SERVICE

By example, encouragement and action, Haines has not only produced results in public service but also encouraged many other architects to do so. As Task Force Committee chairman of the United Church for Christ, he brought together <u>unions</u>, <u>business</u>, <u>churches</u> and <u>industry</u> to set up the non-profit Hawaii Council for Housing Action which has sponsored a large number of low cost housing development of real human quality. His work with the Pastorial Counselling Service located volunteer ministers for people of low incomes. Stimulated poverty area residents to organize and decide on the use of OEO funds as member of Honolulu Community Action Program.

SERVICE TO PROFESSION

Hawaii Chapter, AIA, has been advanced through Haines' 13 leadership positions. Known as a man of action and excellence, he's often asked to do AIA Task Force work. Formation of annual Pan Pacific Award Citation by Hawaii Chapter encouraging young architects in Pacific Basin countries, outside Hawaii; first awardee, Kenzo Tange. Public relations efforts have put AIA in esteemed position in Hawaii. Chairman of Design Committee five times and now National Design Committee member, through his efforts has greatly aided the Hawaii Chapter position of always being asked an opinion on any public design issue in Hawaii.

DESIGN

An outstanding designer, Haines has informed the public about good design (see articles herewith) and has accomplished and stimulated excellent design within his own firm. (See 9 design awards by AIA, etc. on pages 3 and 3a). His firm being large has not reverted to "business only" approach but is design oriented through his efforts. Haines has strived for an indigenous architecture (see "Isle's Pavilion at Fair Held Lacking Charm"). He has spread his design talents widely as evidenced by many repeat clients. Considered noted authority in Honolulu on low cost housing design.

ARCHITECTURAL PRACTICE

Haines has exhibited a high degree of excellence in architectural practice by elevating his firm to one of the 500 largest in the Nation in 1970, according to Engineering News-Record and his A&E firm of Belt, Lemmon & Lo, was listed as one of the 100 largest in the nation by Architectural Forum in 1946. If you refer to the education portion of this portfolio, you will see Mr. Haines has spent many years teaching what he knows to students at the University of Hawaii.
