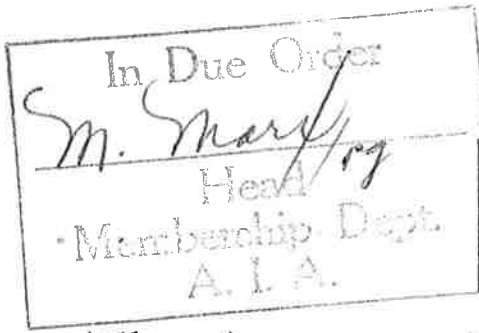

Dear Mr. Puchall:

We are in receipt of your letter dated June 22nd with the application for corporate membership of Mr. Pedro Lopez, his check for \$20.00 and other data.

We are unable to process his application in the absence of a chapter's recommendation.

When an application is denied at the request of a Chapter, the Chapter is not obligated to account for such action to neither the applicant or The Institute.

An applicant whose application was previously turned down may reapply one year after the Secretary of AIA notifies him of non-admission. Therefore, Mr. Lopez is eligible to reapply.

It is suggested that the Chapter investigate the matter further. Perhaps you may wish to consult with the applicant. At any rate, the responsibility rests with the Brooklyn Chapter and if it is satisfied that Mr. Lopez is qualified for corporate membership, under the conditions described in Chapter II, Article 1, Section 1b of the By-Laws, and is able to comply with the Standards of Professional Practice of The AIA, there is no reason why he should not be admitted. Judging from the information on his application form, certainly all appears to be in order.
