



2023 AIA Future Forward Grant

Sample Application

Overview

A two-year pilot project launched in 2022 by the Large Firm Round Table (LFRT) and the AIA Young Architects Forum (YAF), this grant supports students, emerging professionals, and early career architects in the testing of new ideas that disrupt the traditional conception of practice, process, and product in the field of architecture. The primary objective of the Future Forward Grant is to perpetuate innovation in the practice of architecture by empowering students, emerging professionals, and early career architects to do things they would not otherwise have the capital or resources to accomplish. This grant seeks to fund untested ideas and advance exploration, innovation, and disruption in the architecture profession.

Applicants may submit proposals within the following categories:

- **PRACTICE:** supports programs that foster leadership development, advance the organizational effectiveness of professional practice, and redefine firm management strategy
- **PROCESS:** supports programs that promote firm culture, streamline workflow, and establish new methods of project delivery
- **PRODUCT:** supports the development of new prototypes, programs, or technologies that advance the practice of architecture

Grant sponsors

The Large Firm Roundtable (LFRT) is a 501c6 member organization. (Independent of the American Institute of Architects (AIA); and which collaborates with the national and local chapters of the AIA as appropriate.

The Young Architects Forum (YAF) is a member group of the American Institute of Architects (AIA) and is organized to address issues of particular importance to recently licensed architects (within 10 years or less of first licensure)

Eligibility

The YAF+LFRT Future Forward Grant is open to the American Institute of Architects (AIA) members who have been licensed to practice architecture for fewer than 10 years, Assoc. AIA members, and members of The American Institute of Architecture Students (AIAS). All applicants must be in good standing with the AIA or AIAS, whichever most directly applies.

Grant Amount

There is a maximum of \$10,000 in grant money available to one or more proposals. Grant proposals may be made in increments of \$1,000. Proposals with matching funds are encouraged.



Schedule

The application period for the Future Forward Grant is February 24, 2023, through April 2, 2023, at 11:59 pm EST. Grant proposals will not be accepted after the April 2, 2023 deadline. Incomplete applications will be immediately disqualified.

The Grant Jury will meet during the month of April 2023 and recipients will be announced in May 2023.

Recipients will be required to submit a 1-page report on the program (successes, lessons learned, benefits, etc.) upon completion of the program. 50% of total funding will be provided upon approval of grant. The final 50% of grant will be provided after receipt of the 1-page program report.

Grant Winner Deliverables & Expectations

The selected winner will be expected to:

- Participate in monthly calls to report on their progress with a YAF representative
- Provide a monthly written project update, no more than one paragraph with any additional media or materials as needed
- Make a 50% and 100% progress virtual presentation to the Large Firm Round Table
- Contribute to YAF led publications and social media engagement
- Submit to present the project as a session at the 2024 AIA Conference on Architecture

- Amount of funds requested

Nomination/ Reference Letter *

Please include a letter of nomination or a reference. Letters should be a maximum of (1) page and must include your original signature. Nomination letters may be addressed to the "Future Forward Grant Program Jury."
