It'll create a summary from a long legal document, recommend resources for research and, by the time you read this, make your bed and bring you coffee. With this type of AI tool, there are ethical issues, legal issues, bias issues, quality issues, creativity issues, copyright issues, issue issues... and issues we haven't even considered. Join us for an in-depth look at ChatGPT and similar tools to learn more about where it came from, how it works, what can it do, how can it help you do your job better, who does it hurt, and most importantly, how far can it go?
